INTRODUCTION

- President Rodrigo Roa Duterte (2016) in his first State of the Nation Address, delivered at the Batasang Pambansa Complex on July 25, 2016 reiterates his call to fight criminality and illegal drugs, calling on the Philippine National Police, the barangay chairpersons, the Mayors, the Governors and all those occupying seats of power and authority not to lower their guard.

INTRODUCTION

- In Dinalupihan, Bataan, the campaign resulted to more than 800 surrenderers, according to the Philippine National Police Dinalupihan Police Station and from those who were “Tokhang”, they were assessed as to whether they will be sent to the Rehabilitation Center or to the Reformation Center dubbed as Bahay Pagbabago.

INTRODUCTION

- The Bahay Pagbabago in Dinalupihan is located at Barangay San Benito, Dinalupihan. Since the more than 800 surrenderers cannot be accommodated at one time, they were grouped to smaller number.

INTRODUCTION

- Each month, 50 surrenderers undergo reformation so that when they will be integrated back to the community, they have already understood their problem with drugs and would make vital steps towards real change.

INTRODUCTION

- Through the full support and generosity of Mayor Ma. Angela S. Garcia, the program offers temporary refuge with the objective of reforming drug surrenderers into self-sufficient and law-abiding members of society once they are reintegrated back to the society.

This study sought answers to the following:


- (1) How may the profile of the drug surrenderers be described?
- (2) What are the reasons why the surrenderers got involved in illegal drugs?
- (3) What are the reasons why the surrenderers have entered Bahay Pagbabago?

This study sought answers to the following:

- (4) What intervention is the most helpful to the surrenderers?
- (5) What are the number of surrenderers who experienced relapsed after reintegration?

FRAMEWORK OF THE PROGRAM



METHODOLOGY

The study uses data triangulation which Olsen (2004) defined as the mixing of data or methods so that diverse viewpoints or standpoints cast light upon a topic. The mixing of data types known as data triangulation, is often thought to help in validating the claim that might arise from an initial pilot study.


METHODOLOGY

The study employed the triangulation using survey data and key informant interview (KII) among the reformists and some family members, and key personalities running the Bahay Pagbabago in Dinalupihan, Bataan.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- Based on the analysis, drug dependency requires no age limit, though it is clear that the oldest surrenderer recorded at Bahay Pagbabago is 65 year old and the youngest being 18 year old, interview with the surrenderer indicates that there are some of them who have encountered drugs in a much younger age when they were in Elementary.




AGE OF THE SURRENDERERS


- This only shows that drug problem penetrates even the safe zone of schools and in most cases affected the schooling of so many, as proven by the number of surrenderers who never have the chance to acquire education higher than high school, validated by the responses and sharing of the reformist on their regrets of not finishing their school because of drugs.



- It is clear why occupations of surrenderers like driver, construction worker, vendor, mason/carpenter and welder use the illegal drugs. Based on the account of the surrenderers, they resort to illegal drugs because of the nature of their work where they need energy to endure night-long wakefulness or tiresome day of work.

- During the implementation of the problem checklist survey to the participants of the 'Bahay Pagbabago' which was further validated in the conduct of one-on-one interview, the data reveals that the reasons which characterized the starting point of use of the drug by the participants includes: Family Issues; Peers' Influence; Curiosity; Influence of a Relative(s); Nature of Work; Depression; and Low Self-esteem

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- Data reveals that on Family issues, being one of the top reasons of drug use, surrenderers have indicated that having experienced financial difficulties push them to involve themselves in illegal drugs. Some argued on the experience of having affected by the so called favoritism within the family, having a strict parent or a nagging wife, and some just want to find a way to escape from the toxic life they experienced in their family.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- During the first few months of the implementation of the war on drugs of the government, many have surrendered to the Municipal Police Station of Dinalupihan and was included in the 'master list' of people who are in one way or the other have their involvement in the illegal drugs. However, there were claims that their names were included in the 'master list' for some reasons other than 'kusang loob'.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- Conversely, on the reasons why they enter the program in Bahay Pagbabago includes: Self-decision; Family Influence; PNP's Persuasion; Barangay Official's Advice; Forced/Obligated.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- Based on the analysis of data, most of the surrenderers have entered the Bahay Pagbabago to clear their names leading them to self-decision, while there were who have been persuaded by their family to accept the invitation of the local government to enter the program. Additionally, PNP's persuasion plays a vital role in the decision of some of the surrenderers, while some claimed that they were forced or obliged to enter the program, because of the pressure from the community due to the stigma of being included in the "master list".

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- The analysis revealed that among the interventions, Spiritual and Moral aspect was considered the most helpful, followed by Social aspect, Mental aspect, Emotional aspect, Financial aspect and Physical aspect.
- Accordingly, the evening reflection, a daily activity, was considered the most helpful among the activities under the spiritual and moral aspect. Likewise, Encounter with God, a culminating activity was considered helpful in participants' self-reflection which leads to one's self-forgiveness and forgiveness to others.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- On the other hand, after three years of the implementation, analysis of the data collected reveals that from the total of 899 surrenderers who subject themselves to the Bahay Pagbabago program, 29 or 3.23% of surrenderers have relapsed and are now among the persons deprived of liberty (PDL) while their cases are being heard at the trial court

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

- Based on the findings of the study it is recommended to recalibrate some of the vital areas of the program. This points towards the need to act and make a move on revisiting the program that pertains to the bridging or after care program which is basically focused on the community reintegration and employment support of the participants.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

- It is also recommended to redesign the approach for the After Care Program and some of the activities and validate the concept through a dry run using a small group of samples coming from the graduates of Bahay Pagbabago before adapting it for full implementation.
